This is for the healing of our human hurts in obedience to the instruction in James 5:14-16. The oil represents the Holy Spirit. Your coming forward represents your faith and submission to the will of God. All needs may be brought into the presence of God ~ needs for physical, emotional, or spiritual healing, as well as intercession for the needs of others.**
